How Does the School Help Your Child in the Transition

- The Guidance Counselor meets with all grade 6 students in the month of August.
- The Section Head organizes a student orientation program in the first week of school.

How Does the School Help Your Child in the Transition

• Teachers plan for class orientation during the first week of school.

 Parents may schedule meetings with teachers/guidance counselor/section head to discuss concerns.
