





STUDENT ASSESSMENT POLICY

Purpose

At the start of these booklets, the parents are also given the opportunity to share comments.

Grade 1 & 2

Students at these levels are assessed using classwork, quizzes, homework, and then instead of a final exam at the end of the quarter like G3-12, these students complete projects that are marked as classwork.

Grade 3-12

The remaining students are graded on attendance, classwork, homework, quizzes, and the quarterly exams. The grading weighing is detailed below.
